Language Arts: This week we will discuss how the UDHR relates to events from Esperanza Rising. Students will analyze the reactions of characters and how they contribute to the text. Students will also describe how the chapters in Esperanza Rising contribute to the overall structure of the text. We will continue to explore additional stories of children around the world using the nonfiction book, "This Life of Mine." As a reminder, students will have independent work each day to complete when we sign off our live meets. Additionally, students will need to read independently for 30 minutes and record the reading in their reading logs

Science: This week we continue learning about the human body. We will focus on the muscular, circulatory, digestive, respiratory, and nervous systems.
